Wine: 2011 Mueller Pinot Noir
Russian River Valley

Production: 400 cases

Fermentation: Aged in 100% French oak, 100% ML fermentation

General Notes: Our 2011 Russian River Pinot Noir is produced from a careful selection of pinot noir Dijon clones grown near the banks of the Russian River. The vines are located on well drained, gravelly sites less than one mile from the river—the “middle reach” of the appellation. This area experiences the full impact of cooling fog which travels up the rivers banks. During fermentation, we punch down the cap by hand several times each day to gently extract the grapes flavors and aromas. The wine is aged in French oak barrels, of which about 35% is new.

Tasting Notes: This wine has a deep, rich cranberry color and displays aromas of sweet, Bing cherries, raspberry and smokey, toasted oak. The flavors are full and rich, with cherry fruit and oak being the dominating themes. It is medium bodied, with refreshing, tangy flavors and tannins, which are fine grained, soft and rich, with a finish that is long and flavorful. Its rich array of flavors and aromas will age gracefully and become more complex over the next several years—if you can wait that long!
